

The Clarion City Council met in regular session Tuesday August 5th, 2025, at 5:00pm in the Council Chambers with Mayor Pro Tem Flurer presiding. Present were Council members Dan Hennigar, Nick McOllough and Mike Ennis (Mayor Heiden – absent, Shayne Hennigar- resigned). Also, in attendance City Administrator Clint Middleton, Attorney Zach Chizek and PWD Jon DeVries.

Mayor Pro Tem Flurer called the meeting to order and polled the council for any conflicts of interest with the agenda, there were none. Mayor Pro Tem Flurer asked if there were any citizens listed to address the council, there were none.

Motioned by McOllough seconded by D. Hennigar to approve consent agenda consisting of Minutes- 2025.07.15; Financial report- approve checks; Licenses/Permits- (Building, Liquor, Tobacco, Sign, Peddler, Street Closure) Liquor: Variedades Hernandez LLC; Building: Davis – garage, Matul – deck, Tausz – addition, Torsell – fence, Walker - house (Motion passed 4-0).

Motioned by McOllough seconded by Ennis to approve Resolution 25-46) approving Pay Request #29 with Peterson Construction for WTP Project for \$142,500.00 (Motion passed 4-0, resigned S. Hennigar).

Middleton presented on a new Accounting Software the city is looking into. The current software is moving to a cloud version and the cities on that upgrade are having huge problems, to the point many cities in the area are switching to a new provider. This will be a huge headache and will come with upfront costs but in the long run the annual service is cheaper than the current. I look forward to having a formal request for the next meeting.

Reports from the Council or Dept heads: DeVries reported on activity at the airport with 7 crop planes and 1 helicopter. Melinda Anderson of the CDA presented on a newsletter that is done in Clear Lake that she feels Clarion should also look into doing.

Motioned by McOllough seconded by Ennis to adjourn. All Ayes. (Motion passed 4-0).
