Motioned by Flurer seconded by Ennis to approve Resolution (25-59) approving disposal of real estate to Pelico (Motion passed 5-0).

Reports from the Council or Dept heads: Jen Littlejohn gave a plug for the Chili fundraiser on the 19th. Meal includes not only chili but also cinnamon rolls (Midwest favorite combo). Greg Littlejohn was also in attendance representing the Fire Department and gave quick comments. Chief Ter Hark said they served 400 hot dogs on Halloween night.
