

The Clarion City Council met in regular session Tuesday November 7TH, 2023, at 5:00pm in the Council Chambers with Mayor Rod Heiden presiding. Present were Council members Andy Young, Dan Hennigar, Shayne Hennigar, Nick McOllough and Dave Flurer. Also in attendance City Administrator Clint Middleton, City Attorney Chizek, PWD DeVries, and Chief TerHark.

Motioned by Young seconded by S. Hennigar to approve Resolution (23-73) Authorizing Transfer Motion (Motion passed 5-0).

Motioned by Flurer seconded by D. Hennigar to approve Resolution (23-72) Awarding Grant writing/administration for future upper story CDBG application (Motion passed 5-0).

Motioned by D. Hennigar seconded by McOllough to approve Second Reading of Ordinance 625 - Adding Chapter 172 regarding Setoff (Motion passed 5-0).

Motioned by Andy seconded by S. Hennigar to approve Presentation of Street Finance Report FY23 (Motion passed 5-0).

Comments from the Council or Dept heads: McOllough mentioned all the good comments on the Wright County Mass Casualty Event held in Goldfield. Questions on how long the pile of sheetrock will be on Main Street. Chief TerHark said Officer Nino is back from a successful Academy and is working shifts again. Police Dept also served over 300 hotdogs from the Aquatic Center on Halloween night. Mayor stated a special appreciation for the Bursh and Grass piles that the city has for all the residents. It has helped a ton with this year's tree issues. Request to look into the Purple lights in downtown.
